The New York City LGBT Pride Rally is arguably the oldest continuously held civil rights event in the Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual and Transgender community. The first Rally occurred one month after the 1969 Stonewall Riots in Washington Square Park. In the following years, the Rally has had many homes including Central Park and Union Square. After outgrowing Union Square, we moved to beautiful Bryant Park in 1997.

2008 marks the 40th Rally, and our 12th year in Bryant Park! Sadly, this 4 hour free concert in the park is not attended nearly as well as it used to be. Maybe it's because it usually coincides with Father's Day. That is not the case this year. The Rally will be on Sunday, June 22nd, one week later. We're anxious to see if that helps bring in a bigger crowd.

Please understand, the Rally is a gift that HOP gives to the community. There is no charge, no business sponsorship, no income. It is our free speech, civil rights event. We want you there to participate and accept this gift.

Why is this important? Well for one thing, the Rally showcases LGBT talent – singers, comics, rappers, spoken word. We try to cover all styles and tastes. This is not an amateur hour; we bring you professional, successful artists who happen to be lesbian, gay, bi and transgender – or at the very least, our straight allies. These talented members of our community donate their time and deserve our support.

More importantly, in between the entertainers, we have wonderful speakers from every part of the LGBT community. Last year, they collectively addressed marriage equality, anti-gay violence, gay/straight families, religious support for gays and lesbians, youth, AIDS and other issues. We're getting activists and experts to come and talk to you for free. They deserve our eyes, ears and hearts.

So, this is a call to give us your time for four Sunday afternoon hours in a beautiful park. It's free, it's fun, it's food for your soul. It's YOUR Rally.

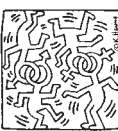

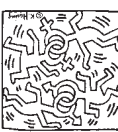

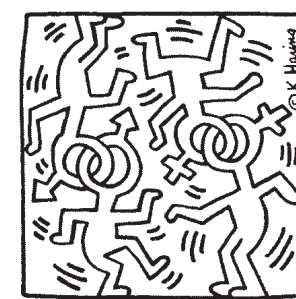

# Gotta Dance!

Tickets for Dance 22, Heritage of Pride's largest fundraiser, go on sale May 1st. Dance 22 will be held on Sunday, June 29th. In May only, tickets are \$45. Once June rolls around, you'll pay \$55. Mark your calendar, make a note in that Palm Pilot you're always fussing with and otherwise remind yourself to get down to one of our ticket outlets to take advantage of our early-bird price. The fine people at Universal Gear at 140 8th Ave; Wear Me Out at 353 West 47th Street; and Village Apothecary at 346 Bleecker Street will be able to set you up. All tickets are also available at [www.boxofficetickets.com](http://www.boxofficetickets.com).

There are a very limited number of tickets available for \$75 on June 29th. If you like the adrenalin that goes with waiting until the last minute, these tickets will be available only at Universal Gear.

Beginning May 1st, all our outlets will have those magical Dance 22 VIP tickets for \$150. In addition to an enlarged VIP area and a huge viewing platform, your \$150 gets you an *open* bar, fresh fruit and premiere view of the fireworks.

Tickets for Rapture 5, the dance on the pier for women, also go on sale May 1st. Rapture 5 will be held on Saturday, June 28th. General admission to Rapture is \$30. This event has been growing by leaps and bounds, and has become a staple event for women during Pride Week in New York. Rapture 5 starts at 6:00pm, and is the perfect place to celebrate after the Dyke March. A very limited amount of VIP tickets will be available for \$40. This VIP ticket will secure you admission into Rapture 5, as well as Lover Girl's Pier Pressure dance party at Chelsea Piers, which follows our event. Tickets for this event are available at all of the locations listed above for Dance 22.

Dance 22 and Rapture 5 take place on Pier 54 just opposite 13th Street on the West Side Highway. This years DJ's for Dance 22 are the fabulous Tracy Young and the wonderful Joe Gauthreaux. The DJ for Rapture is still under negotiation, and will be announced on the HOP website. New York City's weeklong Pride celebration and the Dance will end with our world-famous fireworks show over the Hudson.

The Dances on the Pier are Heritage of Pride's largest annual fundraisers. Proceeds benefit New York City's Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender Pride Events including the March, Rally and PrideFest. **HOP**

## PRIDEFEST: A NEW BEGINNING

The planning for the 2008 street festival known as Pridefest has been a difficult task throughout this past autumn and winter. HOP's leadership has been negotiating with the city on a location for Pridefest and has run into a number of road-blocks along the way. As many of you remember, in 2007 HOP wanted to both move the festival to Chelsea and the date to Saturday instead of Sunday. During this recent round of talks, the city has once again refused to even consider a festival in Chelsea (or other alternative locations that we suggested) or a Saturday date.

The city has offered one viable location for the street festival. This location is along Hudson Street, from approximately Bethune to 14th Streets. Given a choice of our old space, which did not work because of accessibility and narrowness, or Hudson Street, which is problematic due to the lesser length, HOP has decided to go for Hudson Street. We do not want to be caught like last year with having to cancel the festival because of the city's last minute decision not to give us the Saturday date and the Chelsea location. Hence, HOP is moving forward with this new location.

Pridefest will be held on Sunday, June 28th on Hudson Street from Bethune to West 14th Streets, times to be announced.
